

Not every game requires detailed buildings, most of the time you just want something for cover or to break up the table. That's where "Flats" come in!

To make this simple building, you will need to print out the "Building Parts" file and four of the "Hollywood Flat" pages and the appropriate basing template.

Begin by cutting out, scoring and folding each piece as indicated.

Take one of the wall sections and run a bead of glue along the vertical tab.



Now carefully line up a second wall segment and rub gently but firmly along its length to help set the glue.



Repeat this with the two remaining walls until you have one, long wall section.



Fold the long wall over on itself and run a bead of glue along the single remaining glue tab.



Now fold the adjoining wall over and burnish as before to connect all four walls.





Stand your model up and make it into a squarish shape. Leave it to one side to dry.



Once set, align your building's base with one of the tabs running along the bottom of the walls.




Run a bead of glue along the base in the area indicated.






Carefully align the bottom tab with the gluing area and burnish (rub firmly) until set. Let this section dry before proceeding.



With the "anchor" wall now set, apply glue to the three remaining glue areas and fold the building up into place. Reach down through the top and burnish the remaining tabs. Take care to keep the walls as flush with the base as possible.




Once the main structure has dried, take the large support wall and run a bead of glue along the smaller bottom tab.







Place this in the center of the basing template and burnish til set.

Once dry, glue and burnish the two side tabs.



It's easier to apply pressure to the tabs by laying them down on the table so you can press directly down.

Some might find gluing these tabs overly tedious however, so you might want to consider taping them in instead.




Once the center support wall is in place, repeat this procedure with the two smaller support walls. Although a "+" shape is ideal, roughly centered supports will do almost as good a job.





With the building completed it's time to cap this puppy!

Begin by applying a drop of glue to the triangular tab at the end of one of the roof edges.



Take a second roof edger and attach it, taking care to ensure good alignment.



Then repeat the previous steps with each of each of the remaining edgers until you have a single strip.





Fold the strip back onto itself and apply a drop of glue to the last remaining triangular tab.

Now fold the end of the strip down and onto the remaining tab. Press firmly until set and set aside to dry before proceeding.



NOTE: If you wish to add some of the optional decorative edging to the roof, do so before continuing.


NOTE ALSO: The roof is not a tile and as such should not be glued to foamcore.

Take the roof and flip it over. Run a bead of glue along the edge of the roof.






Now align one of the tabs on the roof edgers and burnish until set. Leave this to one side to dry as before.



Proceed to glue and burnish each of the remaining tabs.



Done! Wasn't that quick and painless? As you gaze at your achievement, take a moment to give it the final touch with some edging.
